OUR HOMES ON NEWTOWN RD

In August 2021, during his tour for the Build Back Better Act, U.S. Senator Tim Kaine joined HabitatNRV at a socially distant groundbreaking event for our 7 Townhome build on Newtown Road in Floyd. Since the event, progress has made leaps and bounds. These homes are well on their way to housing seven new Habitat families.



We recently had a wonderful volunteer workforce turnout from Blacksburg Christian Fellowship. Everyone had the opportunity to install blocking for cabinets, clean out and sweep up the downstairs of almost every unit, and foam gaps in the ThermaSteel panels. We've also finished the roof panels for the first unit.

The project is being funded through the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD)'s HOME Investment Partnership program. Each of the townhomes will have three bedrooms and two and a half baths, solid wood cabinets, composite flooring, zero-step entry with four units being ADA accessible, and all are Earth-Craft certified; saving homeowners 30% on energy costs. The homes are also located within walking distance of downtown. Applications are currently being accepted for potential homebuyers. Those interested are encouraged to apply by going to our website habitatnrv.org.



WENONAH AVENUE DUPLEX



The National Ready Mixed Concrete Association's (NRMCA) "Build with Strength Coalition" has created a new opportunity for HabitatNRV. The initiative to construct 50 sustainable concrete homes in 50 states in five years, has given us the opportunity to use insulated concrete forms (ICFs) for



the first time. The ICF's, provided by Chandler Concrete, are a sustainable, noncombustible concrete building system that will reduce upfront expenses and on-site construction time while maximizing the structure's durability and energy performance.

Several other NRMCA members, have donated and/or discounted materials to this build including Quad-Lock, Salem Stone, Titan American, Roanoke Cement, Solid Rock, and Airfoam. The Giles Technical Center's Building Technology Center has partnered with us on this build to provide students with hands-on experience building a home while helping the community. Currently our staff is working with Conworx to have the concrete poured into the ICF's. We look forward to providing homes safe and affordable homes to two more families in Giles County.

ATMOS ZNE HOME



We've made significant progress on Atmos' Zero Net Energy (ZNE) home in Dublin. Since our groundbreaking ceremony featuring Pulaski County High School's CTE students, Setter Construction, Baseline Solar, and Atmos Energy in September 2022, students and staff hit the around running. Earlier this month, we constructed the basement and main floor walls around the staircase. The cost of this home is covered thanks to the generous

donation made by Atmos Energy. The home is designed to produce as much energy as it consumes within a year. All ZNE homes are expected to have a Home Energy Rating System (HERS) index score of 0, meet Energy Star v3.1 criteria, and gualify for the EPA's Indoor airPLUS certification. This is achieved by using highefficiency natural gas heating, water heating, and air conditioning equipment, building envelope efficiency, and rooftop photovoltaic solar technology.

HENRY AVE GTC/CTE HOME

GTC students did a wonderful job constructing our Henry Avenue Home. Since the home was moved from Giles County and placed atop of its permanent foundation in Pulaski, the dedicated volunteers from the T.G. Howard Community Center have stepped in to complete the remainder of the build along with the students of the Pulaski County Area Tech Center. This is our first partnership with Pulaski County ATC. We look forward to continuing our relationship with them on future builds.

Completion of this home is expected this fall. Applications are currently being accepted at habitatnrv.org/apply.
